DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Why were the people in Nazareth excited about Jesus at the beginning of His visit?
2. What did the people expect Jesus to do in His hometown after hearing about His miracles?
3. What did Jesus mean when He said that a prophet is not accepted in his hometown?
4. How did the people react after Jesus talked about outsiders being blessed in the stories of Elijah and Elisha?
5. What is one main takeaway from this message about knowing Jesus personally instead of just knowing about Him?

Heart-Level Reflection Questions

1. Have I become so familiar with Jesus that I've stopped being surrendered to Him?
2. Do I admire Jesus for His teaching and comfort, but resist Him when He challenges my preferences or pride?
3. Where in my life might I be expecting Jesus to serve my agenda instead of submitting to His?
4. Is there any part of my heart that feels entitled to God's blessings rather than grateful for His grace?
5. If someone looked at my daily life, would they see intimacy with Jesus — or just familiarity with church?
