DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Why was Jesus' baptism an important transition moment in Luke's Gospel?
(From John's ministry to Jesus' ministry.)
2. Why does Luke tell us that Jesus was about thirty years old when He began His ministry?
(What did that age represent in Scripture?)
3. Why do you think Luke includes a genealogy right after Jesus' baptism—even though it feels unexpected?
4. According to Luke's genealogy, who are three key people Jesus is connected to?
(Adam, Abraham, and David.)
5. What does it mean to you personally that Jesus is both fully human and the Son of God?

Heart-Level Reflection Questions

1. Where do you most need to be reminded that Jesus is not distant—but “one of us,” a brother who understands your humanity?
2. When you think about your own story and family background, where do you see brokenness that you long for Jesus to redeem?
3. Adam failed under temptation, Abraham wavered in fear, and David fell in sin—where do you see yourself most clearly reflected in their stories?
4. What does it stir in you to know that Jesus doesn't just come from broken people, but comes to fulfill and restore what they were meant to be?
5. If Jesus truly reigns as the greater Adam, greater Abraham, and greater David, what part of your life is He inviting you to surrender to His leadership today?
