## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What part of Zechariah and Elizabeth's story stood out to you the most, and why?
2. Why do you think God often seems silent before He moves powerfully?
3. Zechariah and Elizabeth were called "righteous" because they lived obediently. What does obedience to God look like in your current stage of life?
4. Zechariah doubted the angel's message even though he had prayed for a child. What makes it hard to believe that God might actually answer our prayers?
5. John was filled with the Holy Spirit from before birth. How does knowing that the same Spirit is in you change the way you view your identity, purpose, or daily life?

### Heart-Level Reflection Questions

1. Where do you struggle to believe that God is still working when He seems silent or slow to act?
2. If righteousness is shown through obedience, what is one clear command of God you need to stop delaying and begin practicing consistently?
3. What long-term prayer have you grown discouraged about or stopped praying altogether?
4. How would your daily life be different if you lived as though the same Holy Spirit who empowered John is truly living in you?
5. Where is God inviting you to step into faith even when the outcome feels impossible—like Zechariah receiving a promise beyond his capacity to believe?
