DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What did the man with leprosy ask Jesus to do for him?
2. Why was having leprosy such a big deal in that culture?
3. What is surprising about the way Jesus responds to the man?
4. What does this story teach us about how Jesus sees and treats people who feel “unclean”?
5. How are we like the man with leprosy in this story?

Heart-Level Reflection Questions

1. Have you ever felt “unclean” or unworthy before God, like the leper in the story? How did that make you feel?
2. What fears or doubts hold you back from fully trusting Jesus, even though you know He has the power to heal and restore?
3. How have you experienced Jesus reaching into your “unclean” places—physically, emotionally, or spiritually—and making you whole?
4. In what ways is God calling you to step out and share your story or testimony with others, like the healed man did?
5. How does it change your view of Jesus to know that He reaches out to us exactly as we are, without waiting for us to clean ourselves up first?
